# **Chegworth Farm Shop**

Notting Hill may be at the heart of our metropolis but that doesn't stop it having its own farm shop. Chegworth Farm Shop first



opened its doors on Kensington Church Street in 2007 with daily deliveries from Chegworth Valley family farm in Harrietsham, Kent.

Bought by the Deme family in 1983 on what used to be part of the Leeds Castle Estate, the farm was established to grow apples, pears and later soft fruit. To begin with this

was supplied to major supermarkets and wholesalers, whose focus was on perfectly sized fruit, rather than the taste and quality. It soon became clear that this was not the way the family wanted to work and so the change to supplying direct to the customer began!

Today the farm covers nearly 100 acres growing over 70 types of produce. Chegworth Valley also produces an award-winning

range of organic juices pressed from fruit grown on the farm.

As well as their own produce, the shop stocks a wide range of speciality products making it a one-stop shop for all your foodie needs. As with any seasonal growers, new products are added every month and October brings a bountiful harvest of English apples and pears, a Chegworth speciality.

Philippa Holland is a jewellery

designer much loved by celebrities and fashionistas alike. Sported by the likes of Lily Allen (at this year's BAFTAS), Sienna Miller and Élle Macpherson, her designs are beautiful, unique and often edgy. Philippa is a real British success story; in

November 2008 she was credited by the Financial Times for being one of the leading young British Jewellery Designers. All of her jewellery is handmade in England in various workshops around the country and her collections are sold through the wonderful Dover Street Market – both in the UK and also in Tokyo.

"Most of my collections are inspired from the natural world," says Philippa. "I love nature and religiously collect biological and entomological specimens such as leaves and insects on my travels, using a technique I call 'cast from life' to re-create them as faithfully as possible into a piece of jewellery. The technique involves creating casts of the specimen which are electroformed to create the piece.

The pieces are then customised with black diamonds, pavé, enamel or gold plate to highlight certain features. My most recent collection features beetles, many of which feature brightly coloured enamel to bring them to life."

With autumn now in full swing, our favourite pieces are her oak leaf and sycamore pod necklaces and rings. 07775 892 315

# hat are values doing in the villa

After a period of unprecedented price acceleration in the 18 months up to June many felt the market was ready for a pause and that pause arrived on the back of Mark Carney's canny pronouncements intended to take the steam out of the

market. Canny because he achieved his desired effect with the threat of fiscal measures rather than the real thing. The threat of imminent interest rate rises gave buyers the excuse they were looking for to cool the market. We believe it's highly unlikely interest rates will go up before the election next May and, if they do, it won't be by significant amounts. The current rate of 0.5% is an historic low and even an increase of I-2% would see rates low compared to those of the past. We are confident that the point where interest rates really begin to hurt is a long way off. (continued on page 2)
